For those interested in the convention, confirmed quest so far are Cmdr Tripp from Enterprise, Rev Bem from Andromeda, and Dr. Frasier from Stargate SG-1.

On the topic of Starfest, I'm looking at getting together a group to do either the Scooby Doo gang or a group of Scooby Doo Villians. Many of the costumes are fairly simple. I'm planning to do the Witch Doctor. If you're interested in participating, let me know.





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
